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Definitions

a. Small Business Concern

The term “small business concern” shall mean a business as defined pursuant to Section 3 of the Small Business Act and relevant regulations issued pursuant thereto. Generally, this means a small business concern organized for profit, which is independently owned and operated, is not dominant in the field of operations in which it is bidding, and meets the size standards as prescribed in Government regulations. Consult your Regional or District Small Business Administration (SBA) office if further clarification is needed.

b. Small Disadvantaged Business Concern

The term “small business concern owned and controlled by socially and economically disadvantaged individuals” shall mean a small business concern that is at least 51% owned by one or more socially and economically disadvantaged individuals or, in the case of a publicly owned business, at least 51% of the stock is owned by one or more socially and economically disadvantaged individuals, and whose management and daily business operations are controlled by one or more of such individuals. Socially and economically disadvantaged individuals include Black Americans, Hispanic Americans, Native Americans, Asian-Pacific Americans, Subcontinent Asian Americans, and other minorities or individuals found to be disadvantaged by the SBA pursuant to Section 8(a) of the Small Business Act. Also included are concerns that are owned and controlled by an economically disadvantaged Indian Tribe or Native Hawaiian Organization. The term “Hispanic Americans” includes U.S. citizens with origins in South America, Central America, Mexico, Cuba, the Dominican Republic, Puerto Rico, Spain, or Portugal. The term “Native Americans” includes American Indians, Eskimos, Aleuts, or Native Hawaiians. The term “Asian-Pacific Americans” includes U.S. citizens with origins from Japan, China, the Philippines, Vietnam, Korea, Samoa, Guam, the U.S. Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands, the Northern Mariana Islands, Laos, Cambodia, Taiwan, Burma, Thailand, Malaysia, Indonesia, Singapore, Brunei, Republic of the Marshall Islands, or the Federated States of Micronesia. The term “Subcontinent Asian Americans” includes U.S. citizens with origins from India, Pakistan, Bangladesh, Sri Lanka, Bhutan, or Nepal.

c. Women-Owned Small Business

The term “women-owned business” shall mean a business that is at least 51% owned by a woman or women, who also control and operate it. “Control” in this context means exercising the power to make policy decisions. “Operate” in this context means actively involved in the day-to-day management.

d. Veteran-Owned Small Business

The term “Disabled Veteran-Owned Business” shall mean a business that is at least 51% owned by one or more veterans or, in the case of any publicly owned business, not less than 51% of the stock is owned by one or more veterans; and whose management and daily business operations of which are controlled by one or more veterans.

e. Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Small Business

The term “Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Business” shall mean a business that is managed and the daily business operations of the concern must be controlled by one or more service-disabled veterans. Control by one or more service-disabled veterans means that both the long-term decision making and the day-to-day management and administration of the business operations must be conducted by one or more service-disabled veterans or, in the case of a service-disabled veteran with permanent and severe disability, the spouse of permanent caregiver of such veteran. Service-disabled veteran means a veteran with a disability that is service-connected. Ownership by one or more service disabled veterans must be direct ownership.

f. Historically Black College/University or Minority Institution

Institutions determined by the Secretary of Education to meet the requirements of 34 CFR Section 608.2. The term also means any nonprofit research institution that was an integral part of such a college or university before November 14, 1986. Institutions meeting the requirements of Section 1046(3) of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1135d-5(3)). The term also includes Hispanic-serving institutions as defined in Section 316(b)(1) of such Act (20 U.S.C. 1059c(b)(1)).

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g. HUBZone (Historically Underutilized Business Zone) Small Business Concern

The term “historically underutilized business zone” shall mean a business that is a small business by SBA standards. It must be owned and controlled at least 51% by U.S. citizens, or a Community Development Corporation, an agricultural cooperative, or an Indian tribe. Its principal office must be located within a “Historically Underutilized Business Zone,” which includes lands considered “Indian Country” and military facilities closed by the Base Realignment and Closure Act, and at least 35% of its employees must reside in a HUBZone.

h. Alaska Native Corporation (ANC):

ANC means any Regional Corporation, Village Corporation, Urban Corporation or Group Corporation organized under the laws of the State of Alaska in accordance with the Alaska Native Claims Act, as amended by 43 U.S.C 1601.

i. Indian Tribe:

An Indian tribe means any Indian tribe, band, nation or other organized group or community of Indians, including any ANC, which is recognized as eligible for the special programs and services provided by the United States to Indians because of their status as Indians or is recognized as such by the State in which the tribe, band, nation or community resides.

j. Large Business Concern:

A business concern that exceeds the small business size code standards established by the SBA set forth in the Code of Federal Regulation (CFR,) Title 13, Part 121.
